

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## REDEVELOPMENT WORK - week 1

The first week has seen the pews lifted up, the floorboards raised, and the radiator disconnected. The pews are being stored in church prior to being sold - do get in touch if you would be interested in buying one! - and the intent is to reuse the floorboards, most of which are in reasonable condition. Meanwhile, plastic sheeting has been installed to prevent the spread of dust around the building. Please accept our apologies that the aesthetic of the building has taken a bit of a hit!

There have already been a couple of surprises: the excavations have uncovered the brick vault of what looks like a small crypt under the west end of the aisle, and a key area seems to have very little in the way of foundations. A structural engineer has been called in to advise on what sort of remedial works might be required.

For now, the intention is to remain 'in the church' for the next few Sundays. We will, however, keep this under review - and if the disruption becomes too much we will look to move out through the summer.
