

## ST PETER'S KIDS: DIGGERS

Here's an update from our leaders about one of our children's groups that meet on Sundays:

Diggers is our group for children in school years 1-4 (roughly ages 6-9) and we meet in the church hall alongside the Bible Tots group (ages 2 - 5). There are around 3-5 children in Diggers on average (although we can have more if there are visitors!) and it is run by one leader with a helper. We start off together with Bible Tots with some songs and a prayer, before leaving them to go into the main hall. We then have our session which is usually a mixture of snacks, Bible stories, crafts, games, and sometimes acting out stories, building Lego, or making visual aids.

During the last couple of terms, we have been working through resources from an organisation called 'Mustard Seeds'. We have been looking at the Gospel accounts through the eyes of Peter, and following his journey meeting and getting to know Jesus, seeing his miracles, hearing his teaching, and witnessing his arrest, crucifixion, and resurrection. We have then continued following Peter through some of the events in the book of Acts, and are currently in Acts looking at some of the events that happened to Paul on his missionary journeys.

The aim of each session is always to teach the Bible in a faithful, fun and engaging way, helping the children get to know Jesus, understand the gospel message, and see how God's word applies to their own lives and to our whole church community. Our prayer as leaders is that the children will grow to know Jesus as their King and Saviour for the rest of their lives, and it is a privilege to be able to be a part of this journey with them.
