

Dear Friends.

- give via MyChurchsuite by going to the MyGiving section, clicking "add a donation", and entering the details.

Wherever possible, we also encourage the use of **Gift Aid**, which increases the value of your gift at no extra cost to you. Regular giving in any of these ways helps the church plan and steward resources wisely, and allows all of us to join together in the work God is doing through St Peter's.
