

A NOTE FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends,

This Harvest, we are again supporting Beacon House, a Christian charity in Colchester that offers hope, dignity and practical care to people who are homeless, vulnerably housed, or at risk of losing their home. Beacon House provides free healthcare through its Primary Healthcare Centre, showers, laundry, and even hairdressing. Guests can also enjoy a hot meal in the café, use IT facilities, receive help with CV writing, and take part in art, crafts and life-skills sessions. Their team also works tirelessly to help people find and sustain secure accommodation.

All of this flows from their vision: "to provide Christ-centred love, hope and acceptance to those who are homeless or without permanent accommodation... bringing hope to the lost through the love of Jesus."

From time to time, we share specific areas where extra help is needed in the life of our church. Each of these opportunities is a chance to serve God, bless others, and grow in faith together. - **Tiny Tots Team Member**: to assist on Thursday mornings with welcoming and hosting parents and young children; no experience necessary; safer recruitment processes will be required [*Tiny Tots Team, volunteer role*]
